



# Historic Monuments of Ancient Nara

Nara was the ancient capital of Japan between 710 to 784 and is home to some of the must-see UNESCO World Heritage Sites in Kansai, including Kofukuji Temple, Horyuji Temple and Todaiji Temple, home to the magnificent 15m-high seated bronze Buddha.









#### Sacred Sites and Pilgrimage Routes in the Kii Mountain Range

The Kii Mountains have been a mecca for pilgrims since the Heian-era and include the three sacred mountains of Yoshino-Omine in Nara Prefecture; Koyasan (Mt. Koya) and Kumano in Wakayama Prefecture.

#### Himeji-jo Castle

With a major restoration project completed in 2015, Himeji-jo Castle has been restored to its former, brilliant white glory. Also known as the White Egret Castle due to its passing resemblance to a bird taking flight, Himeji-jo Castle is one of the most beautiful castles in Japan.



# Buddhist Monuments in the Horyuji Temple Area


Horyuji Temple, founded in 607 by Prince Shotoku, is acknowledged as the oldest existing wooden structure in the world. Its numerous structures are registered as a World Heritage Site, including the 32m-high five-story pagoda, the main hall built from 28 massive wooden pillars and its central gate.

SPECTACULAR VIEWS

Picture-perfect lakes, wind-swept dunes, seaside panoramas... away from the hustle and bustle of the cities are some areas of outstanding natural beauty that deserve to be included in any Kansai itinerary.







#### Hikone-jo Castle

A picturesque castle offering commanding views over Lake Biwa in Shiga prefecture. Designated a National Treasure, Hikone-jo Castle was constructed in the 1600s by the li clan.

#### Mikatagoko (Mikata Five Lakes)

A beautiful wetland area in Fukui prefecture, consisting of five interconnected lakes, each with its own unique water qualities. The area is surrounded by some 80,000 plum trees that blossom magnificently in the early spring.



#### Amanohashidate

Renowned as one of the three most beautiful sights in Japan, Amanohashidate is a natural 3.6km sandbar on the Tango Peninsula that when viewed upside down between your legs, resembles a bridge to heaven.  $P^P$  and  $P^P$  when viewed upside down between your legs, resembles a bridge to heaven.






#### Tottori Sand Dunes

These ancient, naturally occurring dunes along the coast of the Sea of Japan are breathtaking for their sheer size alone. They are Japan's only large scale dune system, and part of the San'in Kaigan UNESCO Global Geopark.





## San'in Kaigan UNESCO Global Geopark

Spanning the rugged Sea of Japan coast between Tottori and Northern Kyoto, this UNESCO Global Geopark is of significant geological importance since it holds the key to understanding the formation of the Sea of Japan, some 20 million years ago.

#### The Night Views over Osaka and Kobe

Hike up, bike up or take the cable car – the views from the top of Mt. Rokko across Osaka Bay are spectacular any time of day, but are truly magical after dark and locally known as the 10 Million Dollar View.

The tidal whirlpools in the Naruto Strait between Naruto and Awaji Island are some of the most famous in the world. During the spring tides, some of the whirlpools can reach 20m across.







# Ancient Kyoto Area

A major feature of the city, Kyoto's Cultural Properties consist of 17 sites selected from a long list of choices that speak to the many layers of the ancient capital's history. Centering on architectural structures and gardens and based on criteria befitting World Heritage status, these properties were chosen according to their excellent state of preservation, with factors such as possession of high-ranking National Treasures (for structures) or Places of Scenic Beauty (for gardens) and overall designation as a Historic Site taken into consideration.



#### Nijo-jo Castle

The castle was constructed in 1603 by the Tokugawa shogunate as protection for the old Kyoto imperial palace and as a residence for the shogun in the capital. The Ninomaru Palace at its center is representative of traditional samurai-style residential architecture, with each room painstakingly and spectacularly decorated.




#### Kiyomizu-dera Temple

It's said that in 778 the monk Enchin enshrined Kannon at the Otowa waterfalls, which was then followed by Sakanoue no Tamuramaro establishing a Buddhist temple there in 798 on the orders of Emperor Kanmu. The Hondo (main hall), also known as the "Kiyomizu Stage," forms the center of the temple and was rebuilt in 1633 in the Kake-zukuri style. It's a splendid construction of closely gathered tall pillars, intersected with crosspieces. As well as each of the buildings within the grounds, there is also the Jojuin Garden that uses early Edo period Shakkei landscaping techniques.

#### Byodoin Temple (Uji City)

This was originally a villa for Fujiwara-no-Michinaga. His son Yorimichi converted it into a temple in 1052, in the late years of Heian Period. The Hoodo, an image of which is featured on the 10-yen coin, represents the Land of Happiness which noblemen dreamt of. Its elegant figure is very famous and tells us the prosperity of the Fujiwara family.





#### Ryoanji Temple

This Zen temple opened when Hosokawa Katsumoto reconstructed the old villa of the Tokudaiji family in 1450. It is renowned for its rectangular white-sand Karesansui-style garden that stretches from east to west, in which 15 rocks of various sizes are laid out. However, all 15 rocks can never be seen at once. This represents the teaching of Zen – to not always seek perfection. The interpretation of this theme relating to the garden may vary depending on the viewer's thoughts and emotions.

#### INSIDER TIPS

#### Ninja footsteps

Can you pass undetected along the corridors of Nijo-jo Castle? Likely not, since the unique Nightingale floorboards are designed to creak under foot to warn of intruders.

# P Hikone-jo Castle and Castle Town Area

Hikone-jo Castle is a delightful castle and a National Treasure. It features a daimyo lord's residence at its base and offers picturesque views all year round. Enjoy its cherry blossoms in spring, its verdant greens of summer, its crimson leaves in fall or its snow-covered beauty during winter. The area surrounding the castle evokes a feeling of the town in ancient times, when it was once prosperous with the castle at its center, and provides visitors with a fun shopping experience. Look out for Hikone's uber-popular mascot character "Hikonyan" – a samurai cat. He can often be seen in Tenshu-mae Square or at the Hikone-jo Castle Museum.

#### Hikone-jo Castle ①



One of only five Japanese castles designated as National Treasures, Hikone-jo Castle was the seat of the li clan. It has a three-story keep of stone walls with beautifully curved roofs.



#### Hikone-jo Castle Museum

A restoration of the Omote Goten (front hall) that used to be both the fief office of the domain and the official residence of the daimyo. Here you can find many craft products, archives, arms and famous treasures kept by the successive li family lords on display. During spring and fall, Noh plays are also performed on the Noh stage.

#### Yume Kyobashi Castle Road

A shopping street that extends from Kyobashi bridge, which crosses the inne moat of Hikone-jo Castle. Designed to make you feel like you're back in the castle town with its Edo period machiya townhouses, it is lined with souvenir shops and places to try local Shiga cuisine and also offers hands-on workshops to try making candles, kotoyaki ceramics and Japanese washi paper lanterns.



# GENKYU-RAKURAKU-EN

#### Genkyu-rakuraku-en (Genkyu-en Garden)

This park consists of the daimyo lord's residence at the foot of the castle and the daimyo's garden (Genkyu-en), a beautiful example of a traditional Japanese garden and designated site of National Scenic Beauty. It's also listed as part of a newly recognized Japan Heritage Site under the title "Lake Biwa and the Surrounding Scenery - The Water Heritage of Prayer and Living."

# INSIDER TIPS

Yakatabune

Take a boat trip around the moat in a traditional Edo-era Yakatabune. The 50-min leisurely cruise provides a wonderful perspective of the castle and gets you up close and personal with the local wildlife. Particularly beautiful during the cherry blossom season. ¥1,300 for adults. ¥600 for elementary school students and younger. (Free for children of age 3 and under.) The fee for adults is ¥1,500 when the cherry blossoms are in bloom





# Obama and Wakasa Area

Since ancient times Wakasa has been known as the "land of food" as it supported the food cultures of ancient Nara and Kyoto with an abundance of fresh produce. It's also the point where sea routes from the continent join land routes to the capital. Over a long history of comings and goings, the ports, castle towns and inns along this highway prospered, and the festivals, entertainment and Buddhist culture of those passing through led this area to develop in a unique way. This group of highways that start in Obama City are commonly referred to as "Saba Kaido" (Mackerel Road) and feature townscapes and a bustling merchant culture reminiscent of its ancient heritage.

#### Uriwari no taki (Breaking Waterfall)

This is a waterfall that comes from spring water bubbling from the Tentokuji Temple grounds along the ex-Wakasa Highway. The surrounding area is called the "Water Forest", where water bubbles up noisily even during the summer and travelers once came to quench their thirst. It was considered sacred ground and has long been a training ground for monks following mountaineering ascetic. A statue of Fudo Myoo is also enshrined here.



#### Kumagawa-juku Historic Post Town

This logistical relay point on Saba Kaido (Mackerel Road) was once a post-station town developed for military and strategic needs. Today, the preserved traditional architecture stretching along the ex-Kumagawa Highway consists of painted merchant houses and storehouses of varying shapes and sizes and offers a glimpse of the area's former activity. It has also been designated part of a National Important Preservation District for Groups of Historical Buildings.



#### Miketsukuni Wakasa Obama Food Culture Museum

A facility dedicated to showcasing the history of the area's food culture, largely through incredibly realistic plastic replicas. Here you can discover 30 different ways to prepare mackerel and learn about the Edo-era techniques used to preserve locally cauaht flounder.

#### INSIDER TIPS

#### The Isaza Experience

Obama is a picturesque port town along the Mackerel Road and a good place to spend a few hours, if not only to try the local delicacy – eating live isaza fish. Isaza are the young of "ice goby" fish and are caught during March and April. At just 4cm long and translucent, they are swallowed whole with just a little soy sauce or ponzu for taste. The dancing sensation of the tiddlers in your mouth is not for the fainthearted, but makes for a great story to share with friends back home.

# Amanohashidate Area

Along with Matsushima (Miyagi Prefecture) and Miyajima (Hiroshima Prefecture), Amanohashidate is known as one of the three most beautiful sights in Japan. Viewing the natural 3.6km sandbar from a distance, with its white sandy beaches and pine trees, does not disappoint.

The annual events: Aoi Matsuri – the oldest festival in the Tango region – Defune Matsuri and the Miyazu Toro Nagashi Fireworks draw large crowds, but the area is generally bustling with people all year round.

#### Amanohashidate View Land



Take the chair lift or monorail to the hilltop 130 meters above sea level. If you look at Amanohashidate from here, it looks like a dragon ascending to the heavens, so it's also known as "Hiryukan" (flying dragon view).



#### Motoise Kono-jinja Shrine

An old shrine of the greatest standing in the Tango region and home to the National Treasure, the "Genealogy of the Amabe Clan" in addition to the Important Cultural Property the "Shinzen Komainu Stone Guardian Dogs." The five-colored suedama motif on the rails can only be seen here and at Ise Shrine.

#### Kasamatsu Park

A famous place reached by cable car or chair lift for observing Amanohashidate by bending over and peering between your legs (mata-nozoki). By looking from between your legs, the land and sky get flipped upside down, and the sand bar looks like a bridge to the heavens.



#### Chionji Temple

Known as a sacred ground for the Buddhist deity Monju Bosatsu, it is one of the three Monju temples in Japan. It has the largest temple gate in the Tango region and houses many Important Cultural Properties including a two-story pagoda.

#### Chienowa Wisdom Ring Lantern

Erected in the early 18th century to protect the boats traversing the canal, this Buddhist stone monument is said to grant wisdom to anyone that passes their head through the ring three times.



#### INSIDER TIPS

A visit to Amanohashidate is best enjoyed as a day trip from a base in Kyoto. Take the Hashidate Express from Kyoto Station (2 hrs) and enjoy the beautiful green, mountainous scenery along the way. Rent a bike (approx. ¥400 for 2 hrs) and cycle across the sandbar for a truly unique experience.



# Toyooka Area

Toyooka is located in the northern part of Hyogo Prefecture and is the main city in the area and the biggest city in terms of surface area in the prefecture. It's known as the last remaining wild Oriental White Stork (Konotori) habitat in Japan and at the forefront of projects to protect, breed and reintroduce these endangered birds back into their natural habitat. As well as storks, it's home to many sightseeing and leisure spots including the Takenohama Swimming Beach, the Kannabe Plateau Camping Grounds, skiing areas and the famous Kinosaki Onsen (hot springs). It's also known as an area that produces bags.

#### Kinosaki Onsen (Hot Springs)

Well loved since ancient times by artists and writers, these are the most famous hot springs in the Kansai area. It has seven open air baths, each with their own histories and origins.



#### Genbu Cave

A geological heritage site formed by the solidification of lava that flowed from volcanic activity that took place approximately 1.6 million years ago. The hexagonal basalt rock that looks like clusters of pillars is a geographical feature of this site that makes for some impressive natural art. You can see five caves that have names associated with the four Chinese gods including Byakko and Seiryu.



#### Oriental White Stork Park

The first facility of its kind devoted to increasing the number of wild storks in Japan and offering a chance to observe storks in their natural habitat.



#### Izushi-jo Castle Town

Standing among the quiet mountains, Izushi, known for its history and sara soba noodles, is a castle town with a historic atmosphere that is mentioned in the ancient "Kojiki" and "Nihon Shoki" books.

#### INSIDER TIPS

#### Local brow

Be sure to check out Gubigabu in Kinosaki and sample one of the four local craft beers on tap. Their Tajima Beef hamburgers are also highly recommended.

#### Retro fun

Along the backstreets of Kinosaki you can find some wonderfully retro shooting galleries (the cork variety) where you can try your hand at shooting boxes of candies off little shelves at point blank range. The assortment of pinball and other mechanical games are a wonderful way to kill a few hours before the giant dinner feast awaiting you in your ryokan.





# Tottori Sand Dunes and San'in Kaigan UNESCO Global Geopark Area

The San'in Kaigan UNESCO Global Geopark offers an insight into the history and culture of the people that have lived alongside the Sea of Japan since its formation. Its unique coastline and geological features include the impressively large Tottori Sand Dunes and the scenic beauty of Uradome Kaigan with its caves, white sand and mysteriously shaped rock formations. The area is famous for its bountiful seafood, geothermal hot spring resorts and lush natural settings.

#### The Sand Museum

The Sand Museum was founded in 2006 as an exhibition facility for the display of sand sculptures and is the first of its kind on the world. The basic concept of the museum is "A World Tour through Sand" and themes are switched in and out every year.



#### Tottori Sand Dunes 4

The enormous Tottori Sand Dunes are designated as a National Natural Monument.

The wind-blown patterns covering the dunes are examples of the art of nature and can be enjoyed alongside the adjacent "The Sand Museum" which exhibits unique man-made sand sculptures.

#### Uradome Kaigan 5

If you want to enjoy the sea, try a pleasure cruise, and if you want to enjoy the beach, take a stroll down the promenade that runs along the coastline. Viewing the beauty of this place up close is a the best part of coming here. With its crystal clear waters, Uradome Kaigan is a popular swimming beach during the summer and a great place for sea kayaking or snorkeling.



#### Hot Springs

You can enjoy lots of charming hot springs in the Geopark area including the Iwai Onsen – the oldest baths in ancient Inaba Province with a 1,200 year history - and the Tottori Onsen, whose waters bubble up from the main city in the prefecture.

#### INSIDER TIPS

For souvenirs, the Kotobuki Castle of Sweets has a great selection of Japanese wagashi sweets on offer. The whole building has been built to resemble the ancient Yonago-jo castle. You can climb the keep and get a great view across the town.

#### Award-winning beer

Daisen Brewery produces some fantastic craft beers that have been picking up awards left, right and center. Try them for yourself at their brewpub "Bier Hof Gambarius" located at the foot of Mt. Daisen.

#### Mt. Rokko's "10 Million Dollar Night View"



Make your way to the top of Mt. Rokko and enjoy a spectacular view that extends from Kobe towards the Osaka Bay area. It's an impressive sight anytime of the day, but best known as a romantic night spot and nicknamed the "10 Million Dollar Night View." Access Rokko Mountain itself from either Arima Onsen (hot springs) or Kobe City via a combination of bus and cable car (between Kobe and Rokko) or ropeway (between Arima and Rokko). The view on the way up/down is well worth the effort. Once on top of the mountain, there are a number of things to explore, including an Alpine Botanical Garden, observation deck and Rokko Garden Terrace, where you can grab a bite of lunch and take in the 10 Million Dollar view for yourself.



#### Arima Onsen (Hot Springs)

A charming village only 30 minutes from the heart of Kobe, Arima Onsen is one of Japan's oldest hot spring towns, with over 1,300 years of history. Emperors, revered monks and daimyos have been visiting Arima since the 6th century, seeking rejuvenation in its famed mineral springs. For today's visitors, the most popular activity is still to enjoy a soak in the numerous hot spring baths dotted across town including the Kin no Yu (Golden spring) and Gin no Yu (Silver spring) baths and to explore its quaint, though often





#### Kitano

Since opening up its port to foreign traders in the late 19th century, Kobe attracted wealthy foreign settlers that made their home in the Kitano district. They constructed European style homes and adopted an ex-pat lifestyle that exists to this day. Kitano is a wonderful place to explore on foot with its international vibe, hipster coffee shops and jazz bars.

# Naruto and Tokushima Area

The Whirlpools of Naruto that form naturally in the Naruto Strait are said to be some of the fastest in Japan and also comprise one of the three largest tidal currents in the world. Observing the whirlpools from the Onaruto Bridge or from a special sightseeing boat is popular among tourists. Tokushima's greatest attraction however is the Awa Odori (Awa Dance) Festival, held every August for the past 400 years. Awa Dance is famous worldwide and can be placed Alongside the Rio Carnival as one of the largest dance events in the world. The streets of Tokushima City, the focal point of the festival, turn into a giant dance floor.

#### Temple 1 of the Shikoku 88 Temple Pilgrimage -Ryozenji Temple

The Shikoku 88 Temple Pilgrimage is under petition to become a World Heritage Site and Ryozenji Temple is the first temple of this pilgrimage. Tokushima is home to the first 23 temples and the 66th temple of the pilgrimage. The "Pilgrimage Experience Program" where visitors can participate in a walk to the first few temples is very popular.



## The Whirlpools of Naruto



The Naruto Strait, between the city of Naruto and Awaji Island, is where the Seto Inland Sea meets the Kii Channel. The difference in height between the ebb and flow of the tides and the speed of the currents form some of the world's greatest whirlpools. You can see the whirlpools from above via the Uzu-no-Michi walkway located under the Onaruto Bridge or up close via the sightseeing boats.



#### Awa Odori Kaikan Hall

During August 12-15, there will be Awa Odori (Awa Dance) Festivals going on throughout the prefecture, but you can see the Awa Dance all year round at the Awa Odori Kaikan Hall. At the hall, not only will you have the chance to see the dance but you will also be given a chance to participate.

#### Wonder Naruto

To get the best view of the whirlpools, take a ride on the "Wonder Naruto" boat where you can enjoy a full view of the raging currents from its upper first-class deck for an additional charge. #### Osaka-jo Castle Park

The inner citadel of Osaka-jo castle contains not only the existing castle keep (reconstructed in 1931), Kishu Palace Garden (a kaiyu strolling-style garden) and carved stone plaza, but also 13 structures that are protected as Japanese Important Cultural Properties, including the Otemon Gate, the Tamon Yagura Turret and the gunpowder storehouse. The whole area is designated the "Osaka-jo Castle Ruins Special Historical Site" and affords the visitor a fascinating insight into the castle's history.

In addition to the castle itself, there is a lusciously green city park featuring the Nishinomaru Garden, well known as a place for cherry blossom viewing, and a plum grove packed with beautifully colored flowers in the spring. It is a site where you can feel close to nature even in the midst of the urban sprawl.

In commemoration of the 400th anniversary of the summer campaign of the Siege of Osaka, the original stone walls of the castle, long since lost deep underground, are being re-dug in a public project. If successful, the park will offer visitors the chance to get a feel for this period of dynamic Japanese history by being able to compare firsthand the re-dug castle walls of Hideyoshi Toyotomi's "castle unmatched in 3 countries" with the current, albeit replica "best stone-walled castle in Japan" as rebuilt by the Tokugawa Shogunate.







#### INSIDER TIPS

#### Photogenic experiences

In the main keep you can pose for photos wearing a replica of Hideyoshi Toyotomi's armor, helmet and battle surcoat, and during New Year celebrations, you can also try a footbath and traditional sake.

#### Morning exercise

Osaka-jo Castle Park is very popular with all manner of dog walkers, joggers, cyclists and fitness lovers. It is also a great place to witness scores of elderly locals doing their daily "rajio taiso" (radio broadcast workouts). Get up early and join in, or watch sometimes up to as many as 500 people perform their daily workouts in the inner bailey. It is a sight to behold.

# Mozu-Furuichi Kofungun,

Ancient Tumulus Clusters and Takenouchi Highway Area

Mozu-Furuichi Kofungun, Ancient Tumulus Clusters, are ancient burial mounds constructed between the late 4th century and the early 6th century and include the tombs of Emperor Nintoku and Emperor Ojin, as well as other ancient tombs of varying sizes, and are looking to be awarded World Heritage Site status. Nearby is the oldest highway in Japan, the Takenouchi Highway, along which you will find historical establishments such as temples connected to Prince Shotoku.

#### Mozu-Furuichi Kofungun, Ancient Tumulus Clusters: Nintoku-tenno-ryo Kofun, Ojin-tenno-ryo Kofun

Next to King Khufu's Pyramid and the Mausoleum of the First Qin Emperor, Nintoku-tenno-ryo Kofun is one of the three largest tombs in the world. Constructed in the mid 5th century, it is 486m long and is the largest keyhole-shaped tumulus in Japan. At Sakai City Museum, in the adjacent Daisen Park, you can experience its grandeur on a 200-inch-large screen. In the Furuichi Kofungun, Ancient Tumulus Clusters, there are many graves of varying sizes scattered around, including the second largest tumulus in Japan that belongs to Emperor Ojin. In the nearby Osaka Prefectural Chikatsu Asuka Museum, there are many artifacts on display, including earthenware and haniwa terracotta figures that were buried in the tomb. In the future, the Mozu-Furuichi Kofungun Burial Grounds hope to be awarded World Heritage Site status.



#### Takenouchi Highway – Japan's Oldest Highway

The Takenouchi highway was a road that brought the rich culture of China and the Korean Peninsula – including foreign envoys – to ancient Asuka (modern day Nara), which was said to be an ending point of the Silk Road.



Here you can learn about Sakai's traditional industries including incense, chusen cotton, rugs, kelp, bicycles and Japanese confectionery and pick up some rare items and souvenirs from the gift shop. The facility also houses the Sakai Hamono (Knife) Museum where various rare and professional knives and scissors forged from famous Sakai steel are on display.





#### Sakai Risho No Mori — Sakai Plaza of Rikyu and Akiko

The museum promotes the charm of Sakai's culture and history through an exhibition of the life and work of two of its most famous figures, tea ceremony master Sen no Rikyu and the mother of modern Japanese literature, Akiko Yosano.



## Historic Monuments of Ancient Nara

The area surrounding Nara Park is a World Heritage Site registered as the Cultural Property of the ancient Japanese capital of Nara. This area beautifully preserves the delicate harmony of the traditional wooden temple architectural style of the Nara period, found in places such as Todaiji Temple, Kasuga Taisha Grand Shrine and the Kasugayama Primeval Forest, with its natural surroundings within the mountains and other forests of the region. Traditional annual events and ceremonies are also carried on to this day through its deep-rooted spiritual association with Japanese Shinto and Buddhism.







#### Former Site of Heijokyu Imperial Palace

The ancient ruins of the Former Site of Heijokyu Imperial Palace are located on the northern edge of the center of ancient Nara, a city which once flourished as the capital for over 70 years from 710. The Council Hall in the Imperial Palace, where Japan's politics and ceremonies were carried out, was painstakingly restored in 2010. It was also designated as a Special Historic Site in 1952, as well as being the first example of an archaeological site being registered as a World Heritage Site in Japan.



## Kumano Area

Registered as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2004, Kumano brims with an overwhelming natural power and is part of the Sacred Sites and Pilgrimage Routes of the Kii Mountain Range. This sacred area carries a long history of worship and spiritual devotion, with the "Kumano Pilgrimage" - connecting the three main Kumano shrines - offering a popular route for pilgrims to enjoy a millennium of history. Highlights include Kumano Hongu Taisha Grand Shrine – the head shrine of all the Kumano shrines in Japan, which total over 3,000 in number – and Nachi Falls, the tallest uninterrupted waterfall in Japan.

#### Kumano Nachi Taisha Grand Shrine and Nachi Falls



Mt. Nachi is a sacred site of Kumano faith that includes Kumano Nachi Taisha Grand Shrine - one of the Kumano Sanzan - and Nachisan Seigantoji Temple. Nachi Falls has the highest direct drop in Japan, and the water falling through primeval forest looks divine. This area was designated as a World Heritage in 2004.

#### Kumano Kodo



This is a series of religious routes that lead to Kumano, Japan's largest sacred site. Along with the three Kumano Shrines, this site was awarded three stars by Michelin's Japanese travel guide "Michelin Green Guide Japan," further underlying its must-see status. Walking the Kumano Kodo pilgrimage routes and trying on Heian-period clothing are popular activities among foreign visitors.



#### Kumano Hongu Onsen Village (Hot Springs)

The Kumano Hongu Onsen Village is an area home to "Yunomine Onsen (hot springs)" discovered over 1,800 years ago - the "Kawayu Onsen," where hot water bubbles up from the river, and the "Wataze Onsen" with its large open-air rotenburo bath.

#### Katsuura Onsen (Hot Springs)

Katsuura Onsen boasts a large volume of hot water that comes from over 100 sources. Its famous open-air bath that has been formed in a cave looking over the Pacific Ocean as well as its quiet bay-facing open-air bath are very popular.





#### Shirahama Onsen (Hot Springs)

Shirahama Onsen is one of the three oldest hot spring resorts in Japan and is even mentioned in the ancient "Manyoshu" and "Nihon Shoki" books. Nowadays, it is lined with many ryokan-style inns, hotels and minshuku guesthouses and is the resort spot of choice in the Kansai area.
